

American Eagles

The bald eagle first appeared as an American symbol on the Massachusetts copper cents and half cents coined in 1787 and 1788. Since then, it has appeared on the reverse side of many U.S. coins, including the silver dollar, half dollar and quarter. It has also appeared on the U.S. gold coins that were christened the eagle, half eagle, quarter eagle and double eagle.

Today, the bald eagle has a place on the American Eagle bullion coins. The bird even has its own commemorative coin. Can you match the name of the coin to the correct eagle design element pictured here?
